Basin Villages Forum is the Community Consultative Body (CCB) for villages on the northern shores of the waterway of St Georges Basin. The Forum was set up by Shoalhaven Council to assist local residents liaise with Council, State and Federal Govt agencies etc when problems arise. All residents in those villages are automatically members and welcome at all monthly meetings.

A number of issues were raised at the Forum's April meeting, Councillor Kotlash in attendance offered assistance with some.

Issues were:

- **Bherwerre Wetland** still waiting commencement of works although contractor employed.
- Work delayed on **Palm Beach** section of **The Basin Walk**.
- The **summit meeting of combined Shoalhaven's Community Consultative Bodies** (CCBs) was deemed successful – all in agreement with decision for letter sent to Shoalhaven Council's CEO and also response to inadequate reply from Council re Third Party Insurance.
- Thanks registered to **Tomerong Hall committee** for use of the Tomerong Hall for the combined CCB meeting.

- Also **request for notification from Council** to all CCB's prior to decisions made to the CCB Policy.
- Notification of **Liveability Census** by Council available by link shown on Council & Forum's website.
- Council's **Pedestrian Access & Mobility Plan (PAMP) Review** can be commented on with link from Forum's website.
- Response to Forum complaint for local residents re **uncontrolled dogs on Basin Walking Track**. Comment on Dogs on leash Policy review with input requested. Link on Council website.
- Councillor Kotlash spoke on **Coastal Hazards Conference** held in WA with Shoalhaven Councillors in attendance. Big implications for Councils and residents.
- Discussions being held re **impacts of AirBnB accommodations**.
- Council received a Merit Award from **Sanctuary Point Community Champions** for the Basin Village Green Reserve, Island Pt Rd, St Georges Basin.
- Rezoning proposal for **Erowal Bay land**, Forum to contact Council re RU2 zoning.
- Basin View resident raising alarms at damage to narrow **Mathie/Basin View Pde** with school and company buses continued usage creating dangerous situation. Councillor attending to discuss safety issue at Council.
- Updated suggestions for **speakers to attend BVF meetings** to reignite interest by community into local issues.

# MUCKING IN

## CLIFTON COMMUNITY FOOD GARDEN

**As we mentioned briefly in May our gates opened early, at 9am to coincide with the Huge Garage Sale put on by the Men's Shed and to avail our members to the delicious sausage sangers which the men produced to feed the hungry mob.** Such a great morning, the weather was kind, the sale a huge success and we in the garden had lots of visitors, friends and family from the event, to view the garden and purchase from the fundraising stalls. Many new people are now sharing the delights of Pickles, Chutney and Preserves which Ellen and Charm produce and many Bromeliads from the plant stall have found a different view.

But on **June 17<sup>th</sup> for the Market Day fundraiser we will be back to 10.00am sharp** with the preserved delights, more plants and produce as is available.

The Growing Committee for the garden have been busy planting out all the vegetables for winter and spring which have been started in the greenhouse and Bruce's hot house. The onions and their friends have been carefully corralled in Bed 17 at the rear of the garden, all together, away from all the vegetables that are not friends i.e. peas, beans and any legumes. There are broad beans, across the walkway ..... but that's ok.

**Broad Beans or Fava Beans** as they are referred to in most of the world are a good source of fibre, high in protein, iron and zinc, thrive when temperatures are low and like all legumes produce their own nitrogen. They do not require feeding apart from planting in fertile, composted soil. Beans set up a mutual exchange with soil microorganisms called nitrogen fixing bacteria, which helps them to produce usable nitrogen. Keep the soil moist during flowering and pod formation. Keep the broad bean beds weed-free; cultivate shallowly to avoid disturbing roots.

### Broad Bean Pests:

- Broad beans can be attacked by aphids, bean beetle, flea beetle, leafhoppers and mites.
- Spray aphids away with a blast of the hose, or squash with your fingers on regular inspection rounds.
- Bean beetle and flea beetle can be controlled with sticky traps.
- Exclude leafhoppers with horticultural fleece or spray with insecticidal soap.
- Spray mites with insecticidal soap.

### Harvesting Broad Beans:

Pick broad beans for fresh use like you would snap beans – when seeds are about the size of a pea.

Pick broad beans for drying when they are mature and begin to yellow, usually about 85 days from planting. Allow time for the pods to turn yellow.

Pick the pods before they darken or turn black (a sign of mould); this can happen quickly in humid weather or wet regions.

Dry fava beans in a warm sheltered spot with good air circulation or a food dehydrator set on a low heat. The skin of the fava bean will wrinkle when it is dry.

### Tips and Tricks for Success:

When the pods start to grow on the lower part of the plant it's a good idea to pinch out the growing tip to help the pods set well and reduce the severity of aphid attack.

After harvesting, leave the plant in the ground for as long as possible to boost the nitrogen levels in the soil. The crop which follows in this area will reap the benefits.

**Eye Herbs - Take a Look**

At the dinner table in the 1960's, many good children like me were told of the benefits of vegetables by tricky parents with half-baked theories. "Eat your carrots" they said. "And you'll be able to see in the dark!"

Too precious to perceive parental poppycock, I stumbled around a darkened hallway afterwards for some minutes, hoping for X-ray vision. No such luck. The best that can be said for sure is that carrots are rich in vitamin A and that too much carrot juice will turn your skin orange.

Bilberries are small black berries that supposedly offer the same benefit as carrots – night vision. A popular story is that in the 1940's British WW2 air pilots ate bilberry jam and/or carrots to help them target the enemy during night raids.

The more this story gets repeated the more likely it seems to be true. But actually, like oft repeated gossip there's not much evidence that this actually happened.

Or consider the herb eyebright. With a name like eyebright surely it must make your eyes bright and improve your sight, right?

In the 16th century the "Doctrine of Signatures" theory was that if a plant looked like a disease it would heal a disease – an important name for a half-baked theory.

Eyebright fits right in, as to the average yokel its white/yellow/purple flowers look like a badly bruised eye. Just one problem, it doesn't much work. Another "Doctrine" example was the Quaking Aspen. The leaves of the Aspen tree tremble in the slightest breeze. Surely this was a cure for anxiety?

Patient: "Doctor, I am feeling rather nervous".

Doctor: "Take two Aspen leaves and call me in the morning".

Although this 500 year old theory is now largely discredited, things are not quite that clear cut.

Old habits linger, and the mind is very powerful. If you think something is good for you it often is, science or not. And to be fair, the vitamins, minerals and flavonoids in traditional eye herbs do provide support for tired eyes, as do many fruits and vegetables. However these days, bad eyes require a trip to the doctor or optometrist, not a trip up the garden path. Seek medical advice first. Carrots, bilberries and eyebright can come second.

**Tip: Tired computer eyes?** Put something green on your desk and revert to it frequently. Green (the middle of the spectrum) is naturally refreshing for the eyes. ■

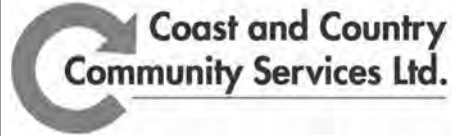

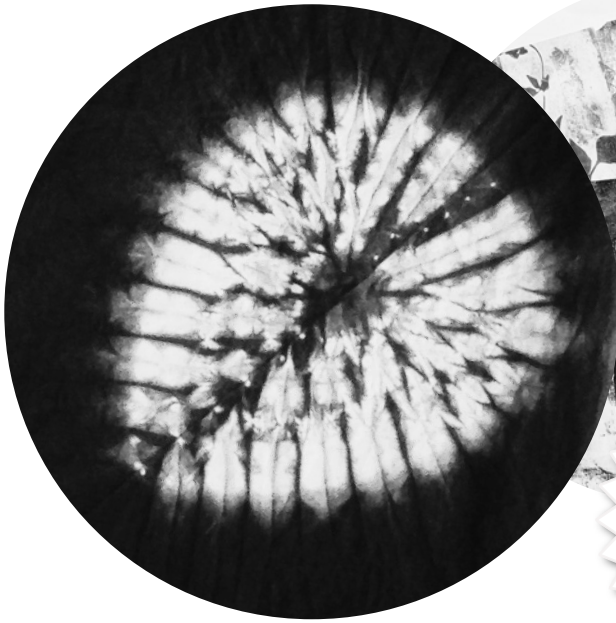

# ALLAN DENT

As we move in to Winter, the first full season has passed me by since *'an ole mate'* of mine has passed on. Allan Dent died in early February at 98 years of age, and while he was obviously an old man by then, why would I refer to him as *'my ole mate'*, having only known him during the 21<sup>st</sup> century? And weren't all those days of yore back yonder in the 19<sup>th</sup> century, and then flowing in to the early 20<sup>th</sup>?

Why then do I say Allan is *'my ole mate'*, despite being close to four decades my senior?

The answer is that we had a common cause. And that is that we both had extended family members living in the Shoalhaven, or Jervis Bay District (as much of it was known then) for quite a lengthy time in the colonial period of the 1800s.

His family pioneered the shipbuilding industry that began the town of Huskisson that we know today. At the same time as George Richard Dent was an acknowledged founding father of that enterprise, my great great grandfather Arthur Smith was working at the Butter Factory at Jindyandy, or to give it its more common locality name used today – Pyree.

Arthur's wife was named Ellen Tighe. She came to the colony of New South Wales from Kilkenny County in her native Ireland at 18 years of age, under a scheme for orphaned Irish girls. Known as the Earl Grey Scheme, this immigration initiative lasted from 1848 to 1850, transporting over 4,000 Irish orphan girls to the colony on twenty ships. Ellen worked for six months in the first half of 1850 as a nursemaid for the children of Edwin Sayers at St Leonards in Sydney. Sayers was a successful owner of coastal trading vessels.

After marrying Arthur Smith in July 1850 at St Mary's Catholic Cathedral in Sydney, their first son Arthur was born in April 1851.

By the time their second child was born in 1855,

Ellen and her husband Arthur Smith were living on the southern side of the Shoalhaven River floodplain at Gindiandi, or Jindyandy, as it is more often spelt today. By 1871, the couple had gone on to have eight children born, by which time Arthur was well established in his employment at the Butter Factory. This was adjacent to and immediately east of the grain mill built by convict labour in 1830.

Meanwhile, in 1861, George Richard Dent had begun a boat building business on the shores of Currumbene Creek. The colonial enterprise that was THE WOOL ROAD (*About.....®* Monthly Feature June 2005) had not functioned for a decade to South Huskisson, known as Vincentia today, by the time the shipbuilding got in to full swing at Huskisson. Brothers Joseph and George Dent would carry on the business well in to the third decade of the 1900s, by which time the Dent shipbuilding enterprises at Huskisson were well known along the NSW South Coast.

When Allan Dent began school at Huskisson, some weatherboard school buildings had been in use for around a decade. Allan had given me a photograph of these buildings which was taken in 1960. I attended an Education Week school assembly with Allan and his wife a year or so after this, at a time when I was doing some work at the school a decade ago. After I showed the photo taken in 1960 to the school principal, she discovered the plans for these buildings from the early 1920s at the school. These became the basis of a small heritage display established within the staff corridor of Huskisson Public School office block soon after that. The 1920s plans were then put into a single frame with the 1960 photo of the weatherboard buildings. Some smaller black and white photos of school children were added to make the corridor display complete. One of these photos was of a group of schoolgirls performing some traditional maypole dancing

across the road from the school at one of the Dent guesthouses – Stromness.

Allan spent much time when he grew up visiting an aunt at Avoca Guesthouse. It fronted Owen Street, and behind this was the oval mentioned in the March **About.....®** Monthly Feature earlier this year. In the last few years we sat out the back of his house a mere hundred or so metres away while Allan reminisced on that era of cricket played by Currumbene Cricket Club teams in what is today the heart of the town. He had been a little boy there spectating the day his uncle CYRIL DENT (**About.....®** Monthly Feature September 2005) had bowled to Australian test cricketer Archie Jackson, which was mentioned in this year's March Monthly Feature.

Allan became no slouch himself, with historian Alan Clark AM penning a biography of his exploits on the cricketing fields in February, shortly after *'my ole mate'* passed away. He had been in the third and last generation of Dent men to play cricket for Currumbene when he played in the 1950s. The Speight Cup was won by that club in the 1892/93 season when Shoalhaven Association formed. In the eight seasons leading up to the turn of that century, Alan Clark discovered that Currumbene had won the SDCA senior competition three times. This tally could have been more as the winners for three of those eight seasons were unknown.

What is known is that the Dent men were prominent in a dominant C.C.C. team during that decade. These included Allan's father James Dent, Cyril's father George Dent, Henry Dent, Mount Dent, Richard Dent and William Dent.

Over a century later ALLAN DENT had become the *'keeper of the faith'* for these men, with the Speight Cup still sitting in his lounge room, the location of which would have been near the boundary of the field on which it was won in the 1890s. Allan passed it on to a family member in recent years, so this trophy is now housed outside the district.

One of Allan's jobs was driving buses from Huskisson in to Nowra for a period, at a time when men from Huskisson were working on the

construction of H.M.A.S. Albatross, and school children began attending the newly opened Nowra High School, the first sole purpose secondary school in the Shoalhaven. He also drove for a bus company to the Far South Coast for a period. A story from this experience was dropping the Dutch cheesemakers at their roadside stop on the Bega to Candelo road. He marvelled at how the very moment they would alight from his bus, they would change their footwear to walk home in traditional clogs along dirt roads, to whichever of the homesteads they lived in. There were many homesteads on the Kameruka Estate, and the Dutchmen worked in its cheese factory.

Allan couldn't remember why he didn't attend the public meeting at Huskisson in 1979, the subject of which was to bring the Lady Denman ferry constructed by members of the Dent family back home. But he was proud that his wife 'Tiny' is remembered as moving the original motion to do so at that meeting. Mind you, many of Allan's collection of historic photos from those days of shipbuilding yore have since been used by the maritime museum set up at Huskisson around this longtime Sydney Harbour ferry.

Stories would come pouring out on some occasions over the years I've visited him. For a time there was a racecourse at Vincentia near the site of today's Leisure Centre, while at other times there were men making a living hunting quail from the bushlands of the local area, to be served as delicacies in city restaurants. There was the telegram, or a copy thereof, that he produced of the day in 1895 when a Cape St George Lighthouse keeper was washed off the rocks by a huge wave, his body presumed to be taken by sharks seen in the area at the time. Edward Bailey's ten and six year old sons unfortunately witnessed this tragic event, unable to prevent their father's demise.

All memories I will now take going forward of the time I've spent with ALLAN DENT. One sunny Winter afternoon last year we sat on his front verandah and yarned till the sun had set, and it was dark. And I finally made my way home. I will certainly miss *'my ole mate'* as more seasons roll by. ■

# WHAT LIES BEYOND Rodrigues Island

Not many people would associate this Portuguese name with a little speck of an island somewhere in the wide Indian Ocean, let alone, pinpoint its position. Named after the Portuguese explorer Diogo Rodrigues by the Portuguese in 1507 who were the first to sight it this, at the time, an uninhabited island.

One of three Mascarene Islands, along with Reunion and Mauritius, and being the smallest at 18 kms in length and 8 kms at its widest, a circumnavigation of the island could be achieved in just one day over and over. But luckily, the road system is not optimum nor a coastal hugger, which keeps Rodrigues quite hidden and does not figure much on anyone's travel itinerary. Lying 650 kms east of Mauritius, most in-comers fly to or sail in should they have good sea-legs.

Rodrigues is a protectorate of Mauritius along with its many uninhabited, tiny islands lying off its coast. It is of volcanic origin, almost totally surrounded by coral reef which only means beautiful lagoons and beaches of every differing shade on the blue spectrum.

The first settlers were French followed by the British which seems to be a pattern of colonisers in this part of the world. Totally unspoilt nature, this island offers up its wide lagoons to all manner of water sports – from fishing, to swimming, snorkelling, scuba diving and on land, deep ravines into which many can dive into via a very dodgy looking rickety bridge and rope system. Totally unspoilt by today's tourism, the pace of life is simple, the charm of the island, unopposed and welcoming.

The language of this part of the world is Rodriguan creole which is a dialect of Mauritian

Creole which itself is a French-based creole and is widely spoken by virtually all its 40,000 inhabitants.

The predominant religion is Catholicism which once again follows the pattern of colonisers with a few Muslims and Buddhists thrown in.

The downside of these island in the Indian Ocean is that they are totally at the mercy of the weather with a high occurrence of cyclones which can and have in the past mercilessly decimated and destroyed, but in true island spirit and fortitude, been rebuilt bigger and better.

Port Mathurin is the capital and is the administrative, judicial and economic centre, although when you arrive there and walk it, it brings you back to possibly what it looked like way back when it was first colonised. Quiet, peaceful, very minor activity which intensifies whenever a ship arrives in the port, the markets are same old-same old whenever they are held. Ancient busses carry the people and their wares from place to place.

Rodrigues is place you go to in order to experience life as it was centuries ago – one can only imagine starting out with one building, working on island time which is whenever you want, working at a pace so slow to erect the next building until finally a little town is established. Then sprawl out and build the first homes, churches, cemeteries, clearing the land for subsistence agriculture and to trade with your neighbour.

The weather is a delight all year round and if I had my lifetime over again, at a young age I would have moved there and found the fountain of youth as you cannot possibly die of stress there. ■

# SLOW COOKER CHICKEN AND VEGETABLE CURRY

## INGREDIENTS

- 8 chicken pieces, bone in
- 1 large onion, sliced
- 1-2 large carrots, sliced thickly
- 6 small medium potatoes, quartered
- 2-3 good handfuls of baby spinach
- 2 tomatoes, cut into wedges
- 1 cup cooked white rice
- 1 cup of chicken stock
- curry powder
- paprika
- plain flour
- salt & pepper
- 2 tbsps yellow curry paste (or more to your taste)
- 1 tspn ginger
- oil for frying
- 1/4 cup of cream

## METHOD

1. Add flour, 2 tspns curry powder and 1 tspn paprika to a bag. Add chicken and shake to coat.
2. Heat oil in a pan, fry each piece in the pan until browned on all sides. Add to your slow cooker
3. Add in carrot, potato and onion, ginger, curry paste, stock, salt and pepper to taste. Cover and cook on high for 2-2.5 hours
4. Remove lid and add tomato. Cook a further 10-15 minutes.
5. Add baby spinach, rice and cream & stir through.
6. Replace lid and cook until spinach has wilted. Approx 5 mins.
7. Thicken with a little cornflour mixed with a tblspn water if needed.

It was compiled by Terry Callaghan in 2012 from the “*Holderness Motorist’s Guide for New South Wales. 1915 – ‘Being a complete record in numerical order of all Cars and Owners registered in New South Wales and containing much other valuable information for Motorists’*” Published by Holderness Motors Ltd. Rawson Place, Sydney.

The original data contains the provision of the Finance Tax 1914 applicable on all motor vehicles and the amount of tax payable per horse power, listing the technical details eg. cylinder measurements, gear ratios and in most cases the price.

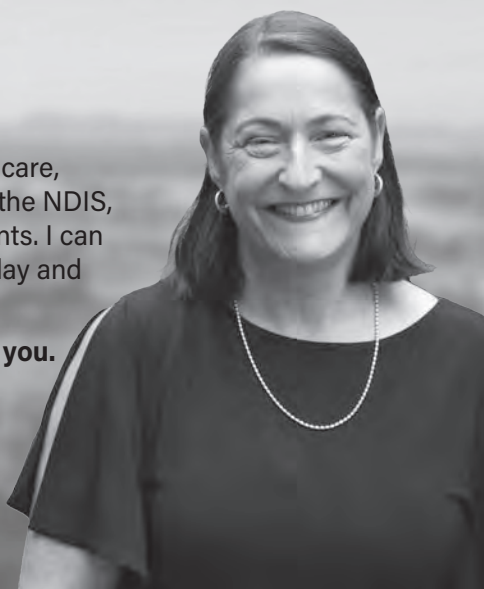

## Have your say about the draft Access Areas for Dogs Policy

**Shoalhaven's Access Areas for Dogs Policy has been revised to better manage dog access areas in line with community expectations, environmental consideration and relevant legislation.** Everyone is invited to have their say about the proposed draft Access Areas for Dogs Policy that provides the process for deciding where dogs can and cannot go in the Shoalhaven, including where they are permitted to be off-leash in accordance with state and federal legal obligation requirements.

The draft policy provides for the adaptive management of each site, allowing Council to respond to changes in the conditions as they arise in off-leash or dog prohibited areas, such as shorebird nesting, biodiversity loss, indigenous heritage and community conflicts arising from high use. The proposed policy clearly outlines processes that will be followed and a framework for decision making in these instances.

Feedback received from the 1400 responses to community consultation undertaken in 2021 has been used to develop the draft policy.

*"This is an important issue to many people in our community, for various reasons, and we look forward to approving a policy that gets the balance right,"* said Mayor Amanda Findley.

*"It's important to hear a wide range of views and perspectives. People who are regular dog walkers, and those who aren't, should get involved and have their say on the proposed draft policy,"* Cr Findley said.

Important factors related to how Council designates dog access areas include state and federal legislation outlining responsibilities of dog owners, Council's responsibilities to protect environmental values, and the accepted health-related and social benefits dog off-leash areas provide to many in the community. The proposed draft policy aims to set the framework necessary to demonstrate Council's environmental and social due diligence.

The draft policy incorporates a colour-coded classification system, based on an easily recognisable traffic light approach (red, orange, green). This system will be used to clearly communicate the three types of dog access areas in public places. It will be used on all new signage to clearly identify dog access areas: red for dog prohibited areas, orange for dog on-leash areas and green for dog off-leash areas.

The existing Access Areas for Dogs Policy will remain in place until a final version of the new policy is approved by Council. All existing off-leash and prohibited areas will be carried forward unchanged during this period.

**The draft policy will be on exhibition for 6 weeks from 1 May until 11 June 2023.**

# BIRDLIFE.....

We are lucky to have such diversity in bird life on the South Coast. We love to interact & watch our bird life close-up. However, these interactions can do more harm than good.

We should never feed birds, sunflower seeds, bread, chips, etc. These foods add calories to their diets whereas in the wild they do not eat fatty diets.

Interfering with a bird's natural diet affects their bones, feathers, eyesight, feet and their ability to escape from predators. It also makes them prone to other diseases. An unnatural diet can shorten their lives.

Birds are born to fly, so why do we cage them and deny them their major need – flying with their own species?

Caged birds are often stressed and bored because they are isolated from their natural flock.

Did you know:

- Using poisons to kill mice can cause secondary poisoning and death to the birds that then eat them.
- Letting cats roam outside is often lethal for birds.



- Feeding sea birds on wharves can cause “bumblefoot” – Their feet are meant to be in water.
- The best way to enjoy birds in your home is to plant “bird attracting” plants in your garden eg. grevilleas, bottlebrush.
