

Bendigo Bank Aerial Patrol

The Aerial Patrol was formed in 1957 following a meeting convened by the City of Greater Wollongong Council. The Patrol's charter, to maintain the safety and the welfare of the community through aerial observation and support, is paramount throughout the organisation and forms to this day the basis for which all operations and activities are conducted and provided.

The Aerial Patrol is probably most widely known for its regular shark monitoring and beach safety patrols along the coastline between Palm Beach (north of Sydney) and Mollymook on the NSW South Coast. These patrols are undertaken on Saturdays, Sundays and public holidays throughout the course of summer October to April and constitute an observation platform for recreational safety be it, swimming, surfing, boating, fishing, bushwalking and the like as well as maintaining a watchful eye on potential bushfire hazards. As well, the Aerial Patrol is available to respond to an emergency 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

In recent years, the Aerial Patrol has expanded its level of service to the communities of the south east region of New South Wales and through its affiliation with the NSW Volunteer Rescue Association, to the regional inland centres throughout NSW.

In 1993, the Bendigo Bank Aerial Patrol was recognised by the then Civil Aviation Authority as strategically well positioned, geographically, for Search and Rescue (SAR) and appointed the organisation as an Accredited SAR Unit.

This was expanded in 2001 to a Tier 1 SAR capability – the highest level of civilian fixed wing SAR in the Commonwealth and only one of three such organisations at that time and in the nation.

Bendigo Bank Aerial Patrol

Parallel to that, a Working Agreement was formalised in 1993 between the Aerial Patrol and the Australian Volunteer Coast Guard by the then Minister for Emergency Services constituting the only such Agreement between a marine agency and an



aerial support agency in Australia. The Aerial Patrol, as a Registered Charity, has relied entirely on a wide range of community fundraising mechanisms to offset its operational costs. The promotion of annual raffles has been without a doubt the Aerial Patrol's most successful fundraiser. Four Local Government bodies within Illawarra and Shoalhaven provide funding towards the operations. A regional sponsorship by the Bendigo Bank and support from various Registered Clubs and local companies also inject funding towards operations. Further, a number of fundraising functions are conducted throughout the year. Together, these campaigns raise the \$700,000+ needed each year to ensure the continued operation of the Patrol's current community activities.

Aerial Patrol personnel undertake their duties in an honorary and voluntary capacity and are rostered for duty 365 days a year 24 hours a day. Air crew consist of 8 fully qualified commercial pilots, 44 qualified airborne observers, 12 accredited dropmasters/ dispatchers and eight radio communications officers. The Aerial Patrol is based at the Illawarra Regional Airport at Albion Park. The charter remains as it was in 1957 and will continue as such, although the area and extent of operations has increased considerably since those early years.

Basin Villages Forum

The recent flooding and subsequent sediment flow into the Basin waterway was seen to be of disastrous proportions. Forum has continually lobbied Council to



ensure adequate stormwater & drainage plans & protective measures completed prior to commencement of works for all developments along Island Point Rd (leading to Island Point) as it was well known with the gradient of the land that once trees were removed and with rain events, the subsequent increased waterflow volumes would cause erosion and create problems for the sensitive lake of St Georges Basin.


The supermarket development had commenced with inadequate stormwater controls in place, the subsequent heavy downpours over two weekends had seen clay and sediment washed down into existing pipelines straight into the waterway TWICE. Council attended the site after receiving complaints from local residents. It is understood legal action is planned but this is seen to be action after the horse has bolted with detrimental affects to the sensitive waterway of St Georges Basin. Forum will continue to lobby and highlight the issue.

Important issues discussed with Forum representation at various Council venues -

• Huskisson Public Foreshore plans: Community Pride Taskforce; Community Engagement Strategy and Open Government Summit.

• One result of the Community Engagement Strategy was setting up of community committee to liaise with Council ensuring input of residents and local Forums (CCB's) were seen as relevant, noted and acted on.

St Georges Basin Country Club Golf Course





For insurance purposes Bushcare members have strict guidelines that apparently does not relate to residents with properties adjacent to foreshore reserves who mow.

• Issue of dangerous tree limbs over local roads not resolved satisfactorily by Council, sent back to Forum for follow up.



• Letter of congratulations to Council for action on Forum's requested Sanctuary Point entrance sign, now in place.

• Community Pride Taskforce set up with community members taking action against graffiti and working for greater police presence in the area.

• Library placement and design at the District Centre still seen as problem.

• National Parks combined submission with Shoalhaven City Council and Southern Rivers Catchment Committee submitted for funding to purchase Heritage Estates for acquisition into the national park system.

• Residents request for support for completion or clearing of pathway near Maroney Ave leading to Anson St (SGB) will be acted upon.



Woollamia to Huskisson Pathway

When the Huskisson Woollamia Community Voice formed in 2005 one of the major issues of concern that was identified – by many people – was a connecting pathway between Woollamia and Huskisson.



MARINE RESCUE NSW JERVIS BAY UNIT "Safety of Life at Sea"



23ft Yacht Emergency

Marine Rescue Jervis Bay was thrown into action on Saturday 18th June 2011 to help search for a missing 23ft yacht that was reported overdue. The vessel left Port Hacking on Friday 17th at 1700 hrs en route to Jervis Bay. A full combined search and rescue exercise was put into action the next morning (Saturday) when the vessel was reported missing by the NSW Police and Marine Rescue NSW. Marine Rescue Units from Sydney, Botany, Port Kembla, Shellharbour, Shoalhaven and Jervis Bay were requested to support NSW Police Marine Area Command to launch an organised search to cover the NSW coast from Sydney to Jervis Bay.

The Jervis Bay Unit was requested to cover from Jervis Bay to Shoalhaven Heads using parallel runs ranging from 1 nautical mile offshore heading North to 3 nautical mile offshore on the Southern return leg. Our category 3 vessel the Colin Woods was used



for the search with a crew of four. Two crew were deployed on the fly-bridge as lookouts, continuously searching for a possible capsized yacht. One crew member was at the helm and the other was the radio operator with radio contact between Marine Rescue Bases at Port Kembla, Shoalhaven and Jervis Bay to receive updates. Constant surveillence was kept using radar and chartplotter electronics.

The search continued from 0700 to 1100 in the morning when a radio message was received that the vessel had been located. All rescue vessels were stood down. The skipper appears to have decided to return to Port Hacking after deciding the seas were unsafe for the passage to Jervis Bay. Unfortunately he did not notify anyone of his return and resulted in a major search at considerable expense. A lesson to be gained here, always loggoff or notify a shore contact of your return. No doubt this incident will be acted on by the Marine authorities.



Bay and Basin Leisure Centre sustainability funding



The Bay and Basin Leisure Centre has been successful in securing funding of 70 thousand dollars to upgrade its energy efficient processes. The funding stems from the Waste Service Performance Improvement Payment program that assists Councils to improve waste and sustainability outcomes within their local government areas.

Heating water and running air-conditioning systems are the most expensive energy uses in our homes. Council's Leisure Centres are heating millions of litres of water for 24 hours a day and running air conditioning units for 14 hours each day, so improvements to the way Leisure Centres use energy is a continual and vital process.

This is part of Council's over all vision of reducing its carbon foot print and energy consumption in order to protect our natural resources and to show leadership in ecologically sustainable development and living.

Over the past five years, Council aquatic facilities have been working on their environmental strategy in offsetting the demand for heated water gas and electricity and water.

Stage one of the process was the installation of solar heating such as evacuated cells which heats water for pool water and heating for the showers.

Stage two was the implementation for rainwater harvesting to use as a top up for councils pool water. This offsets the huge amount of council water usage, as one backwash of the filtration system uses in excess of 20 thousand litres of water. The rain water harvesting tank holds 160 thousand litres.

Stage 3 is site power generation with photovoltaic solar cells. The current system recently installed at Bay and Basin Leisure Centre is 14.1 kilowatt system, which will further reduce energy need for Bay and Basin Leisure Centre.

In the upcoming years Council will be building on this system to double it capabilities in attempt to further reduce council's carbon footprint. These energy efficient and sustainable practices are planned to be implemented at all of council's year round facilities over the next few years implementing similar systems at Ulladulla Leisure Centre and Sussex Inlet Aquatic Centre.

The RAAF at Jervis Bay During WWII

Though Jervis Bay has always been associated with the Royal Australian Navy, during World War II, what is now HMAS Creswell was used by all three services and the British Royal Navy. It was also a residential village and a tourist resort as well.

The Royal Australian Naval College (RANC) built at Captains Point, completed



in 1916 was forced to close in 1930 because of economic pressures. The buildings were leased out to hotel and guesthouse owners and became a holiday resort. The tourist industry became the main source of livelihood for many local residents. The Navy continued, intermittently, to use Jervis Bay.




RAAF Patients warming up at the RAAF No 2 Rehabilitation Unit Jervis Bay

During World War II ships sought refuge in Jervis Bay. The Queen Elizabeth and the Queen Mary, ocean liners refitted as troop carriers, anchored in the Bay on the way to the Middle East. RAN Fairmiles carried out manoeuvres in and around Jervis Bay. Exercises were conducted for navigation and antisubmarine activities.

The Army used the facilities at Captains Point to take stores, supplies and troops to the Battery set up on Bowen Island.

In 1942, the RAAF established the No. 2 Military Rehabilitation Unit at Jervis Bay for convalescent airmen. Former classrooms and offices on the eastern side of the quarterdeck were used. Wing Commander, Dr G. Burniston was commanding officer, and for three and a half years from 1942 about twenty-six women from the RAAF Nursing Service and the WAAAFs, under the care of S/O Gill, provided medical, physio and occupational therapy for injured airmen and ex Prisoners of War. The WAAAFs were also employed in a variety of positions: medical clerks, pay clerks, equipment personnel, nurses, canteen operators and kitchen staff.

During the RAAF occupation, some buildings were added, including a hydrotherapy unit at the rear of the gymnasium. The RAAF also occupied the Commanding Officer's residence and its annex, several married quarters and the former Cooks and Steward's block. To assist patients on crutches, a walkway was constructed between the annex and the CO's residence with runners at the edge to prevent crutches slipping off. Airmen also used the gymnasium and the Quarterdeck for sport and exercise.

The residents of the village supported the war effort and the still intact tourist resort. Elaine Barclay (nee Jarman) was one of the many permanent residents of the village. She was a volunteer plane spotter and she worked in the guesthouses, in Hardiman's General Store and as an usherette at the Cinema. In 1943 she was employed on the switchboard in the telephone exchange, situated in the administrative block.

The British came to Jervis Bay late in the war. The airstrip on the Bherwerre Ridge was commissioned as HMS Nabswick.

Accommodation at the airstrip for men and aircraft was unsatisfactory, so squadron officers used rooms in the hotels and guesthouses of the tourist village. Foley's Hotel was requisitioned for senior officers, while half of Links House accommodated junior officers, and the other half remained 'civilian', occupied by a weekly influx of visitors from Sydney.

The RAAF Rehab Unit remained for a short time after the war to care for ex POWs.

There's A War On! World War II at Home* runs until September 4th. Down to the Wire! The Bay and Basin in WWII runs until September 25. Both exhibitions will be on display in the Vera Hatton Gallery of the Lady Denman Heritage Complex, Dent Street and Woollamia Road Huskisson.

Upper Kangaroo Valley Cycle

If you feel like getting out on your bike for a pleasant days ride try this trip. The route follows the Kangaroo River upstream to where the road ends at a private property gate near a lovely swimming hole known as Flat Rock.

Depending on how long you want to make the ride, suggested starting points are the Kangaroo Valley Showground or Ambulance Station (toilets at both), Hampden Bridge, or the corner of Upper River Road. Directions are simple. Once you cross the Hampden Bridge go about 1km taking the first right hand turn into Upper River Road and follow it

to the end. It becomes a gravel road about half way along with a couple of rocky creek fords to cross, probably best done on a mountain bike, but not essential. The distance along Upper River Road is about 14kms.

Along the way you will see dramatic clifflines that slowly close in on you as you cycle through a mixture of cow paddocks and rainforest, the river with its small races always close on your right. Near the Upper Kangaroo Valley hall is a suspension bridge across the river that is



worth getting off your bike for and stretching your legs. Yarrawa Estate Winery is up Scotts Road and does have wine tasting but it is uphill for just over a kilometre. If you want to see more of the river there are a couple of side roads that take you to a bridge or ford. The turnaround point at Flat Rock is a nice spot for lunch and a short exploratory walk or swim if you are keen.

Enjoy the return journey as technically it should be all downhill from here.

OUR FOSTER

So what does it mean to be "of the Shoalhaven"?

To be born unto this area, to live all but all of your life in the district.

To be a major contributor within your community, like your parents and forebears before you.

For those among us of non-Aboriginal descent who live in the Shoalhaven of today, there are very few people who can



answer that they fit into these categories as well as Foster Emery.

Born in 1922, he was the son, grandson and great-grandson of a Wogamia tradition that started with a land grant to the Glanville family in the mid 1800s. Wogamia House still stands on the family property as it was built way back then, way back when the pioneering spirit of Berry's "*shoals*" haven existed. And significantly, this was at a time when convicts were still tilling the soils of many parts of this district.

When we travel around the district in our vehicles today, we are often passed on the roads by SOILCO trucks on their journeys to deliver the recycled and somewhat structured soil and organic matter that they ply. In recent decade, Foster's sons have grown this business from humble beginnings on the family farm. Before this, back to the decades of the 1920s and 30s, B.F.Emery of Wogamia has been a custodian of that wonderful piece of flat alluvial farmland that sists on the banks of the Shoalhaven River a few kilometres upstream from Nowra. Just beyond Longreach, Bamarang and Mundamia, and reached along a spur down off the road to Burrier, Yalwal and Coolendel, Foster's farm was a country mile out of town for most of his life. For those *About*[®] readers who have visited the property of Bundanon and the Riversdale creative arts centre, the Emery's farmland is all of the bend that is visible on the opposite side of the river from there.

Foster was not only part of a long Shoalhaven farming tradition, he created plenty of his own, accepting all comers as they were. Over many years, his storytelling at sporting functions, and other community and family activities, was insightful, humorous, timely, full of wisdom and advice. And eventually, legendary.

But how does one get to achieve the status of a community elder who oters not only listen to, but always respect?




On 1st March 1931, as a young boy under 10 years of age, Foster was one of the hundreds of youngsters who followed J.C.Bancks (the creator of the cartoon comic strip Ginger Meggs) around during a cricket match at Huskisson organised with legendary Australian test cricketer Arthur Mailey. Mailey was also a noted cartoonist of the time. But Foster had more than good reason to be part of the throng of children at this game for his father Basil was captain of the Shoalhaven XI that day. The legendary West Indian Learie Constantine and the Australian team batting sensation ARchie Jackson were

others that his father's team opposed in this match. Just one of the parts of this experience could be reason enough to inspire a youngster to develop a love for his sport.

80 years later, the Shoalhaven farewelled Foster as its "*Mr Cricket*". An audience estimated to be between 500 and 600 people crowded into Worrigee House to hear the stories that his children had videoed him telling in fireside interviews they had done with Foster and his wife Vinnie in recent times.

In death, he still had people laughing at his humorous way of telling a yarn and enjoying the experience of sharing a life well lived with his thoroughly larrikinish gentlemanly way.

Some of these stories involved his schooldays at The Kings School Parramatta where, it was pointed out to the crowd, sport and not academic pursuits were his passion. One of

the highlights of this experience was a story about the highly disciplined schoolmaster referred to as "Sergeant" who, having given "young Emery" a hard time of many of his days at Kings, could do nothing more than watch with teeth clenched as Foster drove out the schoolgates one day in the car of the school headmaster. He had requested Foster to go an deliver one of his guests to the railway.

Soon after his schooldays had completed, Foster ended up in Canada in the frost and snow as a pilot for the Allied Armed Forces



during the Second World War. These stories on the day were much about survival, and thinking oneself lucky to be alive, but still, Foster managed to introduce humour into these experiences of life. (*To be continued next month*) **John Blackmore**

I hope everyone survived the big cold we had recently, the last month or so would have been a good time to catch up on some boat and gear maintenance that's for sure. The upside is everything has been given a good shake up and that will fire up the fish for sure.

Has everyone heard the one about the 26kg reddie caught in Jervis Bay! Pull the other



leg it plays jingle bells mate. It's amazing what photo shop and text messaging can achieve. Last reports were it was 41kg and fisheries bought it for \$10,000...

The same can be said for rumours of fisheries trawling 6 ton of fish from the Basin for research. Wrong! And threatening fisheries officers at the boat ramp regarding this issue is just plain stupid.

I recently participated in a trawl survey one evening in the Basin. Each trawl was 5 mins long using a 3m by 90cm long net. No more than a dozen fish or prawns per shot were collected, measured and then returned to the water. This method has been utilised for the past few years and valuable data about Recreational Fishing Havens all over NSW has been collected. Large amounts of fish are not being taken and if you do witness such an event you should be encouraged to record boat rego's etc and call the illegal fishing hotline on 1800 043 536

Speaking of netting large amounts of fish in the estuaries, The Shoalhaven Heads Hotel Fishing Club recently delivered a petition to Member for Kiama Gareth Ward calling for a reduction in the amount of netting effort in the Shoalhaven River, citing that professional fisherman from outside the Shoalhaven area are placing too much pressure on an already dwindling resource. In an ideal world it would be great to see our estuaries without nets but the public has a right to eat fresh seafood and professional fisherman have the right to work and earn an income provided they operate within the law. 

Our Macca may be gone, but he will never be forgotten...






